Too Late To Corral

The most frightening reaction, in my opinion, to President Kennedy's speech on Cuba, was the frivolous and joking attitude of many people that came under my observation. "Got your fallout shelter ready?" "Better get out your old musket." These and many more remarks overheard were made in this facetious vein. The truth of the matter is, we Americans are totally blind to the implications of nuclear warfare. We treat it as a joke—but to me it is no joking matter. I am heartily in accord with the stand this country has taken in the Cuban crisis—I have written repeatedly of the dangers inherent in a delaying action policy. I maintain that to preserve our freedoms, our liberties, and even for survival, of ourselves and our neighbors in the Western Hemisphere, we could not have taken any other course. But let's take the matter seriously, for it is indeed a very grave step, and not act like comedians.

Khrushchev's actions in the Cuban crisis will give us some inkling as to the kind of man he really is, whether or not he means it when he says he genuinely wants peace. We'll learn something about what he intends to do about Berlin—and we'll know for sure whether we have a strong man in Khrushchev or a madman like Hitler.
