Wake Forest College, founded in 1834 at Wake Forest, N. C., moved to Winston-Salem in 1958. The Military Science Department was added in 1951. In the past ten years approximately 450

graduates of Wake Forest College have been commissioned as officers in the United States Army Reserve and Regular Army.

The department has a present enrollment of about 400 basic students and around 120 advanced students. The United States Regular Instructor Corps consists of three officers and five enlisted men.
