Minutes Of Board Of Public Works

Edenton, N. C., November 6, 1962. The Board of Public Works met this day in regular session at the West Freeman Street Plant Office with the following members present: Thomas C. Byrum, Jr., Chairman, Jesse L. Harrell, Ralph E. Parrish, J. H. Conger, Jr., and James P. Kicks, Jr.

The minutes of the regular meeting of October 2, 1962, and special meetings of October 12, 1961 and November 1, 1962 were read and approved. Mr. Junius Britton and a group of his friends appeared before the Board and requested clarification of his wife's position. After some discussion the Board upheld its previous decision.

On motion by J. H. Conger, Jr., seconded by Jesse L. Harrell and duly carried, E. and W. bills in the amount of \$25,138.00 be paid. Of this amount, water line extension amounted to \$8,299.71 and power line extensions amounted to \$1,861.35. The bills follow: Gulf Oil Corporation, \$68.57; Bunch's Garage, \$64.22; W. D. The Board authorized the finance committee to use their judgment with respect to renewal of the \$25,000 certificate of deposit that falls due on November 23, 1962.

On motion by Ralph E. Parrish, seconded by J. P. Ricks, Jr., and duly carried, recommendations with respect to awarding of Sewage Disposal Plant jobs will be delayed until further discussions are had with the engineers.

Superintendent Hines reported the completion of the 8" water line into the Industrial Park and advised the Board that service and fire protection was now available throughout this area.

Chairman Byrum called on the committee composed of J. H. Conger, Jr., and J. P. Ricks, Jr., to discuss with John Graham, attorney for Mrs. Zell Ward, the notice sent her that the private line now serving her and others on N. C. 32 North would be discontinued on January 2, 1963.

The committee reported that Mr. Graham advised them that this was an unsatisfactory arrangement and that service should continue in the same manner as at present.

The committee advised Mr. Graham that the Town had provided a 6" water line in the area (N. C. 32 North) and that service was available to Mrs. Ward's property, known as the Chappell Farm, upon payment of the existing service tap charge.

ly charge for one pole installation of Photo Electric Controlled Area Lights is reduced from \$4.50 per month to \$3.50 per month, all other provisions of the contract to remain the same.

This reduction is to become effective with the billing of December 1, 1962.

Superintendent Hines reported that delivery of the 4 3/3 KVA transformers for the Jackson Street sub-station is expected within the next 10 days and that the sub-station should be complete and in operation about December 10, 1962.

Superintendent Hines reported that the cost per foot of installing the water line out 32 North was \$3.40 per foot.

The Board of Public Works reviewed the cost items involved in the N. C. 32 North water line extension and approved same, declaring and establishing the cost, at \$3.40 per foot.

The Board of Public Works declared this would mean that the property owners on each side of the road would be required to pay one-half (1/2) of the cost of \$3.40 or \$1.70 per lineal foot of their property frontage, when they desired to connect to this line, plus 6% interest from November 1, 1962, plus the tap charge in existence at the time of connection.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned. RALPH E. PARRISH, Secretary.
