"There is such a tremendous amount of material on Edenton and this area available," Mrs. Kramer wrote Mr. Harris, "and I am sure Elizabeth Moore as well as myself and others will be more than happy to gather for you any of this material at your request."

In commenting on the film "Ye Towne on Queen Anne's Creek," Mrs. Kramer says it has been shown on over 228 television stations the first year and with only two copies made, they are about worn out and it is planned to have 20 additional black and white copies made for television purposes.
