10 Scheduled to Enter High School and Two In White Elementary School

At a meeting of the Board of Education of the Edenton City Schools, held Thursday of last week, action was taken on the assignment of 12 colored children. The assignment calls for 10 Negro students to transfer from the D. F. Walker High School to John A. Holmes High School and two to the Edenton Elementary School.

Members of the board held an informal conference with parents who had, submitted application for pupil assignment.

In June Negro parents presented reassignment forms to the school board, but they were advised that the forms were for the county administrative unit. They were, therefore, given until July 8 to present their request on the proper forms. The proper forms were subsequently filled out, after which the school board approved the change in
