Golden Text: "Thy way, O God, is in the sanctuary: who is so great a God as our God?" (Psalm 77:13).

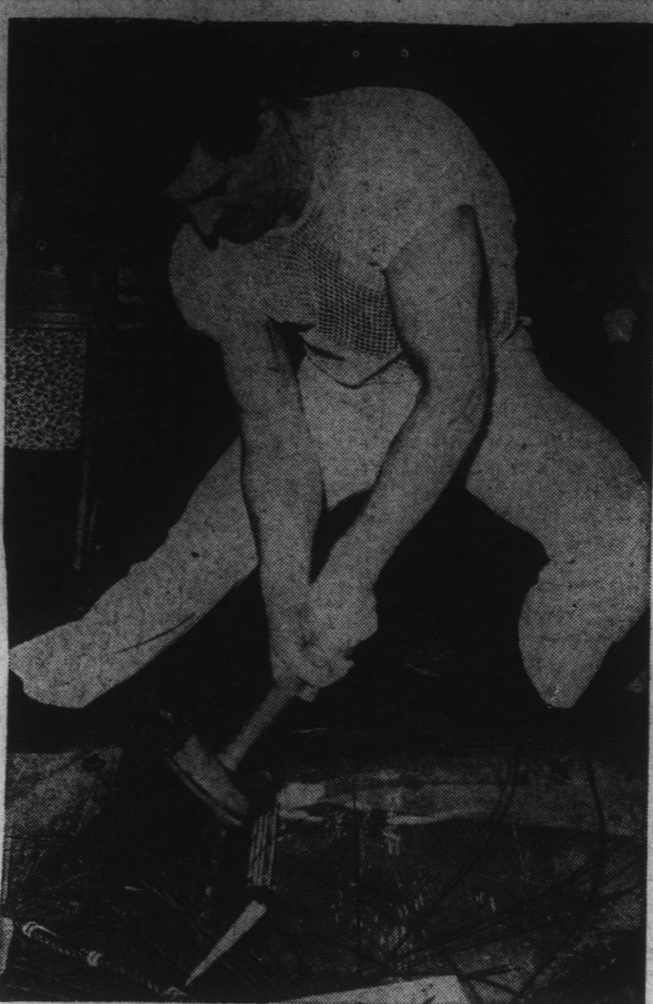

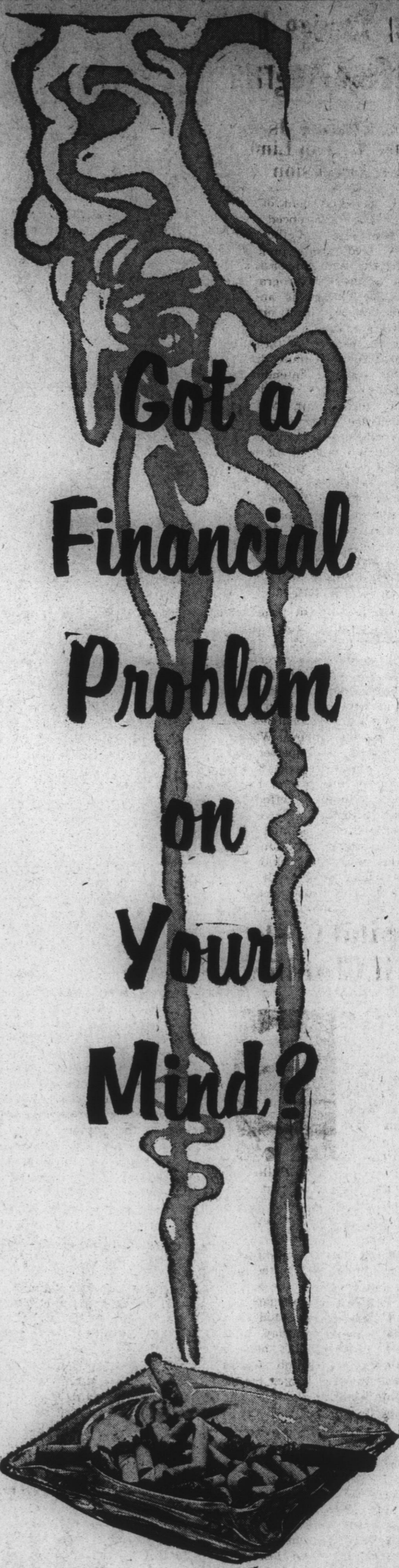
