U. S. Corn Crop Is

Figured to Be Six Per Cent More Than Reported In Two Previous Years

Corn for grain production in 1963 is now expected to total 3.8 billion bushels - 6 per cent more than in each of the previous two years. A crop of this size would be 8 per cent larger than average, but 2 per cent less than the record 1960 crop. The expected acreage of corn for grain of 60.9 million acres is 7 per cent more than last year's acreage. A smaller acreage was signed for diversion from corn

production under the feed grain program in 1963 than in 1962.

The 1963 crop was planted un-der generally favorable conditions and farmers in most areas were able to seed all the acreage planned. Early season prospects indicate a 1963 yield of 63.2 bushels per acre compared with the record of 74.1 bushels last year.—(N. C. Department of Agriculture Farm Report).
