



**OUR SOIL ★ OUR STRENGTH**

L. C. Bunch, Chairman of the Albemarle Soil and Water Conservation District has announced that the District has entered the 18th Annual Goodyear competition to select the nation's 52 top conservation districts.

Activities of the District will be weighed against the performance of other districts in the state in determining the outstanding district in the annual event sponsored by Goodyear Tire and Rubber Company in Akron, Ohio.

Soil Conservation efforts from January 1, 1964 through December 31, 1964 will be considered in the competition and the key agricultural leaders will serve as judges to select the state winners. The grand award for the 52 districts selected nationally will be an expense paid trip to Arizona in December, 1965 for one member of the district governing body and the outstanding farmer cooperator in each winning district. The 104 men selected will be guest at the Goodyear Farm, a 14,000 acre general farm operation, near

Phoenix. The Albemarle District, consisting of Chowan, Perquimans, Pasquotank, Camden, and Currituck counties, won first place in the contest in 1958, the first year it was started. Mr. Bunch and Fahey Byrum, the outstanding cooperator in the District that year, were guests of Goodyear on an expense-paid trip to their farm in Arizona. The District won second place in 1960, and first place again in 1961. George Winslow, District supervisor from the Perquimans Unit of the Albemarle District and Warner Madre, the outstanding cooperator, were the guests on the Goodyear trip in 1961.

The Albemarle District is not eligible to win first place again until 1966, however, by entering the contest each year we will receive recognition for outstanding accomplishments. Mr. Bunch said the District's outstanding cooperator will be selected from about 1600 farm operators enrolled in the Albemarle District Program.
