

\$1,483,302.36 Given to Hospitals and Child Teenager Of Month Care Institutions In Two Carolinas

Appropriations of \$1,483,302.36 o aid Carolina hospitals and child care institutions in financing their increasing load of charity work have been announced by trustees of The Duke Endow-

The funds, based on charity care in the fiscal year which ended September 30, 1963, are the two states. Hospitals receive \$992.921 of the total and child care institutions \$490,381.36. The 105 North Carolina hospitals get \$658,783 and 38 in South Carolina \$334,138. Twenty-six North Carolina child care institutions get \$326,431.62 and 17 in South Carolina, \$163,949.74. The total for North Carolina is \$985,214.62, and South Carolina \$498,087.74.
