
Chesapeake Bay Bridge-Tunnel Officially Opened Wednesday Of This Week

For lomestic I se **Farmers Have Option** To Plant Crop Within Their Domestic Allotment


Details of the new choice program for upland cotton are announced by the Department of Agriculture. It is part of the new cotton program just approved by Congress and signed into law by President Johnson. The new cotton program would work as follows:

The 16,000,000 acre national minimum allotment will be retained for 1964, just as it was for 1963. Farmers who comply with their effective allotments will be eligible for a price support loan of 30 cents a pound (basis middling one-inch cotton at average location).

A national domestic allotment will be established. This is the number of acres required on the basis of the four-year (1959-62) average yield per acre to produce the cotton estimated to be consumed domestically. It is estimated that domestic consumption for the 1964-65 marketing year will rise to 9.6 million bales. At the four-year average yield the national domestic allotment would be 10,766,000 acres. This is about 67 per cent of the 16,000,000 mational acreage allotment. Continued on Page 6-Section 1




