Hearing Scheduled In Wilmington May 18 To Consider Injunction Request


An effort is being made by First National Bank of Eastern North Carolina to establish a branch bank in Edenton. However, the local Peoples Bank & Trust Company opposes the proposal, alleging that the establishment of another bank would do irreparable damage to its business, and therefore sought an injunction to prevent the opening of another bank.
