From WASHINGTON

Washington — The announcement by the National Aeronautics and Space Administration that it is entering into a contract with the North Carolina Science and Technology Research Center represents a real breakthrough in our efforts to take a larger role in the Nation's space program.

The purpose of the work that will be done in North Carolina will be to develop ways and means of utilizing in private industry the technology that is developed in the space program. A great storehouse of knowledge is being built up in many areas of scientific endeavor in our space program. One of the big challenges we have facing us is putting this knowledge to work in private industry.

Under the contract, this type of work will be performed at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, Duke University at Durham, State College at Raleigh, and at the Research Triangle Institute.

Although the original contract

represents the modest expenditure of \$100,000, its real significance is the fact that this is a new approach and a new program. Other than in North Carolina this type of work is being done in only two states, North Carolina is an ideal place to conduct such work. We have both large industries and many small industries in our state and they represent a broad cross-section of our Nation's business and industrial community.

I am sure that once the National Aeronautics and Space Administration and the many contractors this agency works with throughout the Nation get better acquainted with the resources of the Research Triangle we will find that our state will play a major role in our Nation's total space program.

One of the criticisms we often hear of the space program is the fact that it has little, if any, practical use.

It is true that up until this time there has been relatively little application of the knowledge we have developed in our space program to non-space purposes.

Minutes Of Board Of Public Works

Edenton, N. C., May 5, 1964. The Board of Public Works met this day in regular session at 8 P. M. at the Town Office. Members present: Jesse L. Harrell, chairman, J. H. Conger, Jr., Thomas C. Byrum, Jr., J. P. Ricks, Jr., and W. J. P. Earnhardt, Sr.

The minutes of the regular meeting of April 7, 1964, and the special meeting of April 20, 1964, were read and approved.

The extension of a 12-inch sewer main on North Oakum Street to serve a proposed apartment building was discussed. A cost analysis of the extension was presented by Mr. Hines and the Board unanimously decided to install the line providing they receive the proper assurance that the building will be constructed. The cost of the installation will be assessed against the abutting property as provided in the town's sewer extension policy.

Motion was made by Thomas C. Byrum, Jr., seconded by J. P. Ricks, Jr., and duly carried approving the surfacing of the roadways and parking areas at the new sewage disposal plant. The estimated cost of this is \$2,930.00.

Motion was made by W. J. P. Earnhardt, Sr., seconded by Thomas C. Byrum, Jr., and duly carried approving for payment E. and W. Department bills in the amount of \$17,642.30. Bond Fund Account bills in the amount of \$37,265.01, and APW-NC-49G Account bills in the amount of \$27,920.14.

Chairman Harrell directed Messrs. Conger and Gardner to contact J. H. Woodhouse to discuss the acquisition of a permanent right of ingress and egress to the main pump station across the strip of land located behind the Colonial Furniture Company building.

Motion was made by Thomas C. Byrum, Jr., seconded by J. P. Ricks, Jr., and duly carried accepting a bid by Layne-Atlantic Company in the amount of \$1,475.00 to convert the Freeman Street well to water lubrication.

A proposed letter announcing the new reduction in the Town of Edenton's residential electric rate was read and discussed. It was decided to make further revisions and to meet again in the near future for final approval. The letter is to be sent to all E. & W. Department customers with the June 1st utility bills.

The wording of the new utility bills was approved and Mr.

Gardner was directed to proceed with the printing of these bills. The possible discontinuation of use of 2-inch water line serving the M. W. Jackson property and others, was discussed. This was brought about by the construction work now under way by the State Highway Commission. It was decided that since this was a private line, the owners of the line should be made aware of the situation, so that they may decide what steps they wish to take. In order to be of assistance, it was decided that the Water Commissioner should make a cost study of the installation of a 6-inch water main and a 2-inch line similar to the one now in service and present the figures to the people involved.

The resurfacing of Jackson Street was discussed and tabled until the June meeting. Motion was made by Thomas C. Byrum, Jr., seconded by W. J. P. Earnhardt, Sr., and duly carried instructing Mr. Conger to inform Wm. F. Freeman, Inc., that no final payment will be made on Contract 1271 until all the items included in Mr. Hines' report and in the job specifications are corrected. It is realized that items not covered in the specifications will be completed at additional cost to the Town.

Motion was made by Thomas C. Byrum, Jr., seconded by J. P. Ricks, Jr., and duly carried that proper funds be transferred to the general fund when requested by the Building Committee in order to pay the cost of the furnishings for the new Municipal Building.

Motion was made by W. J. P. Earnhardt, Sr., seconded by Thomas C. Byrum, Jr., and duly carried appointing J. Gilliam Wood to the Chowan Hospital board of trustees.

Mr. Hines was directed to meet with Mr. Gardner and Fire Chief Yates with the idea in mind of working out an adequate testing program for the town's fire hydrants.

Motion was made by J. H. Conger, Jr., seconded by Thomas C. Byrum, Jr., and duly carried approving Change Order in the amount of \$446.00.

Mr. Hines was directed to have a 2-inch service line and spigot installed at the main pump station in order to facilitate the cleaning of same.

Mr. Hines was instructed to sign Change Order concerning the price of special backfill material.

Motion was made by J. H. Conger, Jr., seconded by Thomas C. Byrum, Jr., and duly carried that, if in the opinion of the Town Attorney, the town is liable for the \$275.00 paid by Howard Construction Company for a temporary right-of-way, the bills is to be paid.

Messrs. Hines and Byrum were requested to meet with the group of property owners on West Gale Street who submitted a petition for the installation of a water line and explain the correct procedure, present cost figure, etc.
