

### Edenton Group Of Jehovah Witnesses To Attend School

The Edenton congregation of Jehovah's Witnesses is sending 15 teachers and ministers to school for four days. Joseph R. Codespoti, presiding minister, announces that local delegates will be among more than 10,000 attending a district convention in Richmond, Va., July 9-12.

Codespoti said it will be held at Parker Field, home of the Richmond baseball club of the International League. He said people from 16 states have registered to attend, but most of the delegates will come from Virginia, North Carolina, Maryland and the District of Columbia.

According to Codespoti, one of the aims of the convention is to help Christians to serve their own communities as teachers of the Bible. He said the Edenton congregation spends about 135 hours a month in free home Bible instruction here. The Richmond convention is one of 37 conventions held in the United States this year.

### NORTH CAROLINA PEACH CROP FAR SHORT OF 1963

The North Carolina peach crop is estimated at 200,000 bushels, only 13 per cent as large as in 1963 when 1,500,000 bushels were produced.

The late March freeze completely destroyed the crop in many orchards of the Sandhills area. Outside of the Sandhills area, freeze damage to the crop was not as severe and a few orchards will produce a fair to good crop.

The May drip was very light, but the maximum potential production will not materialize because of a drastically curtailed spray program.

# Make Going a Habit Church-

## Sunday School Lesson

THE WHOLE HOUSEHOLD OF GOD  
International Sunday School Lesson for June 28, 1964.

Memory Selection: "You are no longer strangers and sojourners, but you are fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God."  
(Ephesians 2:19).

Lesson Text: Ephesians 2:11-22; 4:1-16

Today the purpose of our study is to clarify in our own minds some of the beliefs, practices, and areas of common witness that we, as Christians, should share.

The Letter to the Ephesians which serves as the basis of our study today was written at a time when there was separation and a great open hostility between the Gentiles and the Jews. Religion was enmeshed in rigid rituals and cannons which too many observed with what bordered on fanaticism, and thus further served to erect a wall between the sects. It was this background that prompted Paul to write what is considered one of the greatest of his Letters to the Church, for its theme was Christian unity.

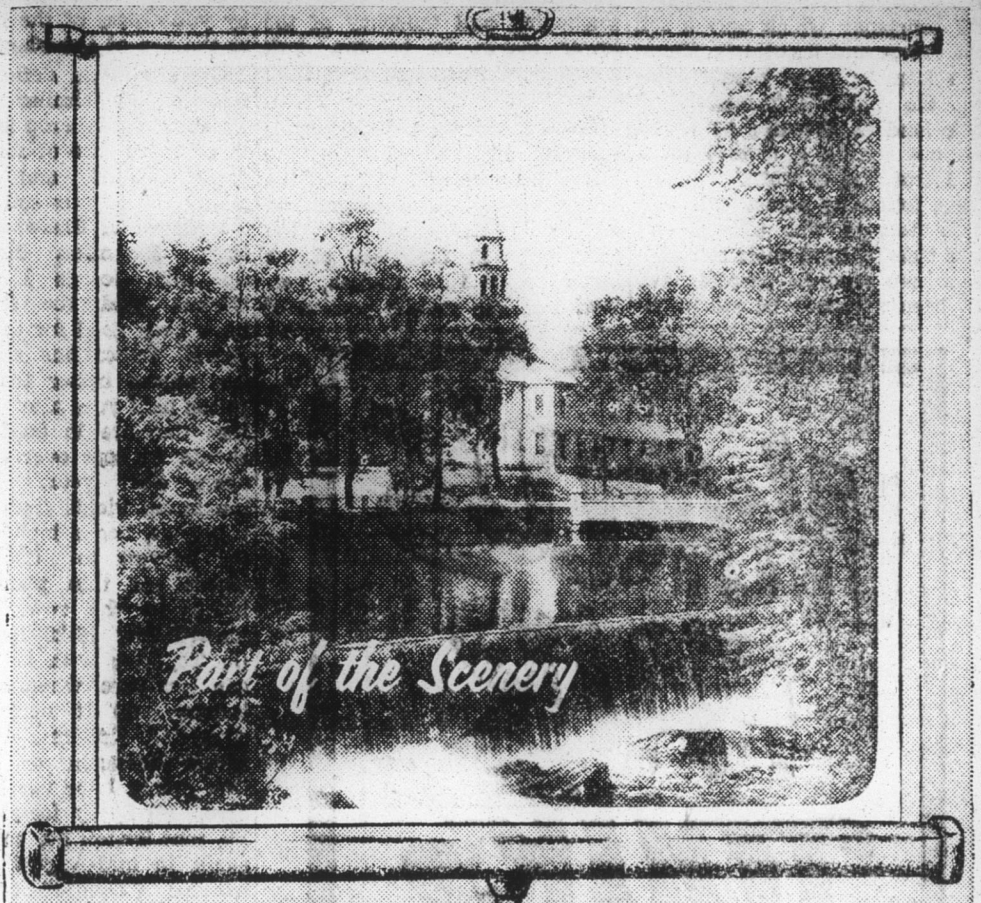
The world is still a divided world... strife exists between man and man, between man and his God. But God has as his plan the healing of the breach, the bringing of harmony between man and man, between man and God. All are to be united in Christ, and it is to be done through the church. The church is to proclaim to those who are at hand, and to those who are far off, that the old war is over. The church is the body, Christ is the head, and all are one.

There is nothing on earth which should unite men so strongly as the love of Christ.

There is no denying the fact that there will continue to be differences in the ecclesiastical systems. Each man will be aware that there are some creeds that he will not be able, in all conscience and honesty, to accept. But a deep and ingrained conviction will acknowledge the fact that it is not a credo that saves or dams an individual... it is God's grace through faith in Jesus Christ that saves, just as it is a lack of this faith that leaves a man lost and groping.

Fortunately for mankind, and the future of the world, God is still acting savingly in Christ for the whole world. Divisions still exist in the Christian church, it is true, but they are not existing as sharply as heretofore. Presbyterians, Baptists, Methodists, Roman Catholics—whatever the denomination—are working together with a greater understanding and tolerance than ever before for the common good. Being dependent on God, they are also dependent upon each other, just as the members of a family are dependent upon each other. And, like the members in a well-ordered family, differences of opinion are accepted and respected. The common, over-riding goal takes preference. Christ is the head of the family.

Membership in the church means ministry—active ministry. The Christian soon learns that resident in God's household requires the strictest discipline and commitment. The boundaries are not localized... they are worldwide. Real church work is not just serving church dinners, setting up bazaars, or arranging church outings. It is the ministry of the church.
