Last year I gave the recipe for my favorite orange bread and have had several requests for it again, so here goes:

Save the peeling from four oranges and boil until tender. Cool, then scrape pulp and white skin from the inside. Combine one cup sugar, 1/2 cup water with orange peel and cook until mixture is thick and syrupy. When this has cooled, grind it in a food chopper. Now for the bread itself:

Cream together 1/2 stick butter, 1/2 cup sugar. Add two eggs, beating thoroughly. Sift together 4 cups flour, 1 tsp. salt, 3 tsp. baking powder and add to creamed mixture, alternating with one cup milk. This mixture will be very stiff. Next add ground orange peel and nuts if desired. Note: Chopped, red and green marshino cherries may be added for color. Bake for one hour at 350 degrees. This recipe makes one long loaf or three small ones. Serve with combination of Philadelphia cream cheese, mayonnaise, chopped nuts and cherries.
