**Cold Oven Pound Cake**  
Here's a recipe for a delicious Pound Cake sent to me by the way of Mrs. Jean Hollar and Mrs. Louise Ervin.

3½ cups of plain flour, 3 cups sugar, 2 sticks oleomargarine, ½ cup Crisco, 1 cup sweet milk, 5 eggs, ½ tsp. vanilla, 1 tsp. lemon extract. Cream sugar and shortening, add eggs one at a time, beating well, then add flour alternately with milk, then flavorings. Start baking in a cold oven and bake for 1 hour and 15 minutes at 340 degrees.

Use net bags from potatoes, oranges, etc., to store things in, such as brushes, laundered mops, etc., so that the air can reach them. Just read too late that if you color your grass seed with bluing before planting it, the birds won't bother it as they don't like the color blue.

Make your own shoe rack. Nail a metal curtain rod on the back of your closet door. Hang shoes by the heels over this rack. A large paper plate glued to the bottom of the paint can, catches drips and provides a resting place for brushes.
