A Lipstick Tip: To set  
lipstick, dry lips by apply-  
ing baby powder for a  
smooth base that will keep  
your lipstick intact without  
caking. Because the powder  
is white, it will also light up  
your lipstick color for a  
frosty look.

Use vanilla extract in your  
water when cleaning your re-

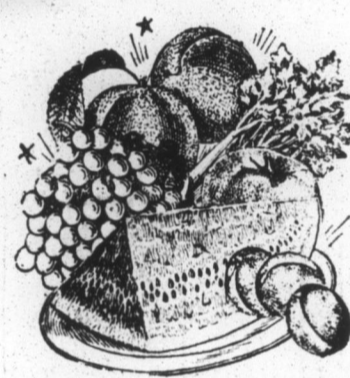
