Tax Report By Sheriff Goodwin

Sheriff Earl Goodwin has collected more than \$156,000 of the 1965 tax levy.

The sheriff, who doubles a county tax collector, reported to county commissioners Monday that collections during November amounted to \$49,482.49. He reported collections of \$106,710 for October.

"December is usually the best month for tax collections," he told commissioners who inquired about progress in this department.

The 1965 levy is \$433,193.41. The sheriff also reported the collection of \$3,000.44 in delinquent taxes during the month. Added to this was \$296.11 in penalties for taxes due back to 1956.

The sheriff reported pickups of \$58.48 plus penalties of \$39.80. Pick-ups are taxes more than 10 years delinquent and this month's records show taxes collected for as far back as 1950.
