of Education met in special session December 15 to name. Supt. Mayo as a replacement for Supt. C. C. Walters, who resigned to accept a post in Perquimans County.

At the same meeting the board voted to join the city school board in requesting the State Department of Public Instruction to send a survey team to Chowan County. The team would study the local situation and give recommendations concerning future school buildings in this county.

This survey will be done before any money is spent by the two boards for school construction.

The board's action followed a December 14 meeting by the joint boards where conditions of merger of the administrative units were approved.

Citizens of Chowan County will vote in 1967 on the merger question and with a favorable vote the boards would become one immediately.

The merged board would consist of 11 members-total membership of the existing boards - and they would serve until 1971, when seven members will be elected.

Trustees of Edenton City to take on the added responsibilities of the county schools and the action was approved by state officials.




