The Bible leads us to God, and teaches us His will. Yet few people know how to read this Book. This is true even of many professing Christians. It has little real value for them. Usually they will not admit this. Thev feel that to do so would be a kind of sacrilege. If they were altogether frank,

they would have to concede that they get very little help from the Bible, and that they do not read it regularly. One woman, young member, said to church recently, "I never someone read the Bible except when I am looking up a passage about which I have had an argument with someone." young man confessed that his mother, who is now dead, had urged him to read "I honestly tried the Bible. to read it," he said, "but I couldn't make anything out of it. I keep it now in the bettom of a bureau drawer."

Others make a practice of reading exactly one chapter a day, but if you press them to tell you what help they get from this reading, they are vague and uncertain. In the course of a conversation a woman said, "The Bible is a wonderful book. I just wouldn't dream of commencing the day without reading my chapter. The ministers question to her "What did you get out of the chapter this morning? What lesson did you learn?" . left her embarrassed. She was able to recall anything from her reading, not only that day but every day. She felt she was accumulating merit by reading a chapter a day. It was the right thing to do, she thought, altogether apart from whether she was helped by her reading

There are many reasons why one might read the Bible. One most important reason is that the Bible is a practical guide to life.



Always preface Fourth: your reading by a brief prayer that God's Holy Spirit will bring the truth of His Word to bear upon your heart. As you open the Bible to read the verses from the place where you left off, yourself this question: "What is God's message for me today?" Exclude from your mind every thought of the application of this message to other persons whom you know in your own home or among your business associates and friends. This is God's message for you. The power of concentration and the ability to apply God's message to your own life, and yours alone, will come slowly. It will increase with your growth in spiritual discipline.




