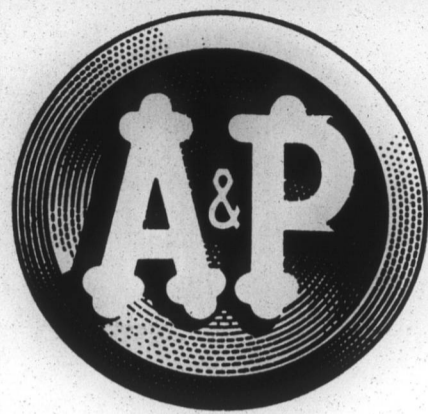
CLASS REUNION
