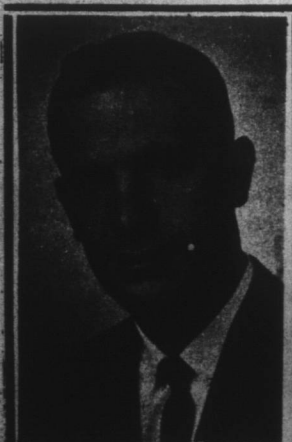
Father Joseph J. Lash, pastor of St. Ann's Catholic Church, announces the following schedule of masses:

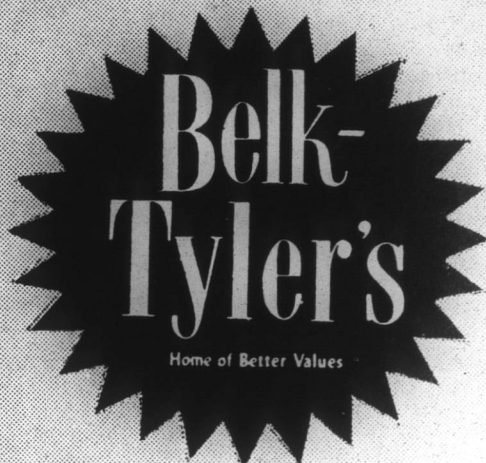

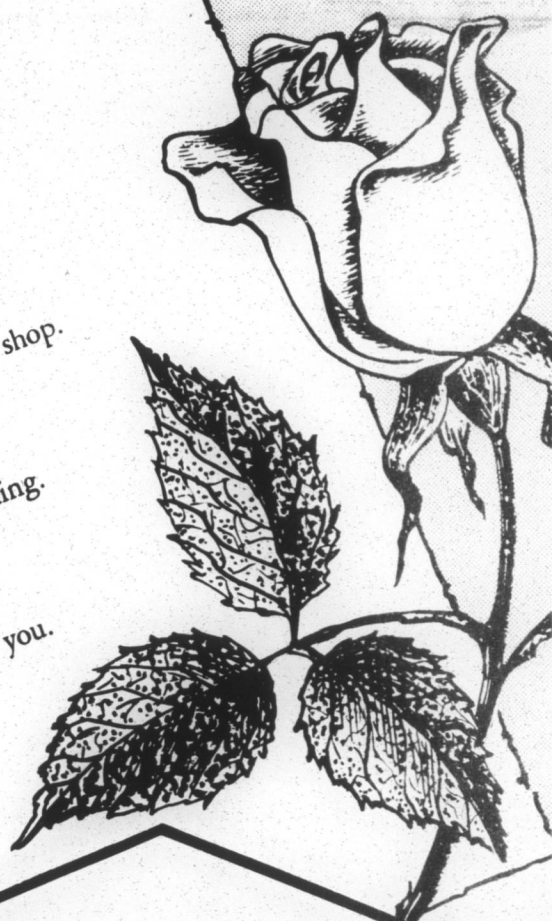
