# New Guidelines **On Food Stamps**

The income scale for obtaining certification for the purchase of food stamps has Mrs. Paul Partin, Mrs. been changed drastically and will allow greater participation among people in Chowan County.

This was revealed here Monday by Mrs. Hazel S. Elliott, acting head of Chowan County Welfare Department, as she made the department's monthly report to county commissioners.

Mrs. Elliott reported that during January, 164 people were certified to purchase stamps. Participation totaled 155 and these families paid \$4,211 and received stamps valued at \$10,258.

The report also showed a total of 521 cases receiving financial assistance and/or service.

The tenancy by the entirety has its origin in the common-law fiction of the unity of husband and wife. The husband and wife were considered as one person for many purposes of our early law, and this concept has never been destroyed or changed in North Carolina in respect to coownership of real property by a husband and wife.
