Cardiovascular Death Rate Among Men Aged 45-64
Shows Overall Drop of 8.4 Per Cent Since 1950

OVERALL DOWNTEEND TO CENTER OF THESE DISEASES AS CAUSES OF DEATH

OVERALL DOWNTREND in cardiovascular death rate for American males aged 45-64, since 1950, is depicted in this chart. While deaths from heart attack gained 4.1 per cent, these from stroke, high blood pressure and related heart disease and other cardiovascular diseases showed sharp declines. It was in 1950 that intensive research programs were begun with Heart Fund and federal tax dollars. The Heart Fund Campaign is conducted here and throughout the nation during February.



## Cardiovascular Death Rate Varies Widely by States



MAP OF CONTINENTAL UNITED STATES shows, in four groupings, by states, the extent to which death rates (males, aged 45-65) from heart and blood vessel diseases fluctuate from area-to-area. Note that all lowest-ranking states lie west of the Mississippi River. Age, sex, hereditary background, dietary habits and degree of urbanization are among possible causes for variation. Nationwide attack against these diseases is supported by the Heart Fund Campaign, conducted here during February.
