LETTER TO THE EDITOR

There have been no known cases of animal rabies in Pasquotank-Perquimans-Camden-Chowan Health District for many years. This is welcome news, perhaps the area has just been lucky and that the area could have an outbreak among its dog population at any time.

Our Health District is located in tourist area and at times dogs are left behind, which may become stray or wild dogs. It is the unwanted stray dogs that are never vaccinated and are most susceptible when rabies is introduced into an area.

Rabies could become a public health problem in our counties. When rabies strikes in a community, it is often too late to protect your dog. The bite of a rabid animal may cause pain and suffering for humans and loss of valuable livestock.

The public health laws of North Carolina requires that all dogs four months of age or older be vaccinated against rabies. Each dog owner has the opportunity to contribute to a community effort with real public health importance by having their dogs vaccinated against rabies. Vaccinations can be given for one or three years.

Vets Corner

EDITOR'S NOTE: Below are authoritative answers by the Veterans Administration to some of the many current questions from former servicemen and their families. Further information on veterans benefits may be obtained at any VA office.

Q. I was retired from service for a disability and now the VA has awarded me compensation. Can I draw both?

A. Only if your retired pay is the greater benefit and you waive, that is give up, an amount equal to your disability compensation.

Q. If I attend school half-time for six months in an institution of higher learning, how much of my eligibility to GI Bill education and training benefits will be charged against me?

A. Three months of your eligibility will be charged against you.

Q. I served for two years in the Army from April, 1955, to March, 1957. Am I entitled to hospitalization benefits from the Veterans Administration?

A. Yes. But if it is not for a service-connected disability, hospital care from the VA is on a bed available basis. The veteran must also affirm his inability to defray the cost of hospitalization.

Q. May I borrow on my GI insurance to help pay college expenses for my son? How much can I borrow?

A. If you have a permanent plan GI insurance policy, you may borrow up to 94 per cent of the cash value of that policy. The interest charge on this loan is 4 per cent.
