Mental Health Week Underway

RALEIGH—North Carolina's state mental hospitals and centers for mentally retarded will join in a nationwide observance of National Mental Health Week, May 1-7, by scheduling a number of special events to which the public is invited.

In commenting on Mental Health Week activities in the state-supported institutions, North Carolina's Commissioner of Mental Health, Dr. Eugene A. Hargrove, said, "I hope many of our citizens will take advantage of this opportunity to see first-hand evidence of our progress and our needs in caring for the mentally handicapped in North Carolina."

Those who have visited our state mental hospitals and retardation centers should pay them a return visit. Those who have never been inside one of these facilities should avail

themselves of this opportunity. Many will be very pleasantly surprised at the changes new and improved treatment and rehabilitation techniques have produced. Others will be discouraged at what they see. But I believe all will go away with more understanding of the problems involved in treatment of our hospitalized mentally handicapped citizens."
