

Guard Promotes John Asbell, Jr.

The promotion of John H. Asbell, Jr. of Nashville, from chief warrant officer W-3 to the rank of chief warrant officer W-4

in the North Carolina National Guard was announced by Gov. Dan K. Moore.

Asbell, a native of Edenton, is a full time employee of the Guard in Rocky Mount. He is married to the former Marian Alexander, also of Edenton.

Asbell graduated from John A. Holmes High School and attended Nor-

folk Business University. He also attended the U. S. Army Adjutant General School at Ft. Benjamin Harrison, Ind., and the Army's Quartermaster School at Ft. Lee, Va.

He began his military career in September, 1943, when he joined the Navy. He served on active duty until June, 1946. He joined the National Guard in

Edenton in December, 1948, and has been recognized for his superior performance since that time.

Asbell is presently assigned as chief of the personnel records branch with the 330th Administration Company in Rocky Mount.

Young People's Social Security Benefits Exceed All Scholarships

Social security benefits being paid to young people 18 to 22 who are still in school amount to more than the scholarships at all colleges and universities in the United States, Secretary of Health, Education and Welfare Wilbur J. Cohen said today.

"In the 1968-69 school year the social security program will pay about \$479 million to approximately 466,000 students entitled to payments on the earnings record of a disabled, retired or deceased parent," Mr. Cohen said. This will be an average of more than \$1,000 to each eligible student.

The school year that begins next fall will mark the fourth year of payments under a 1965 change in the law providing for the continued payment of social security child's benefits past the age of 18. Until that change, Mr. Cohen said, a young beneficiary's payments stopped when he became 18 unless he was totally disabled.

"There is nothing in the law that prevents the student from receiving his social security benefits while he is still receiving assistance from a scholarship fund," Mr. Cohen noted. "Benefits may be paid during vacation periods. If a student works during the

summer months or part time during the school year, and earns \$1,680 or less for the year, he can still collect all of his social security benefits. If his earnings go above \$1,680, he gives up some or all of his benefits, depending upon the amount of his total earnings and how steadily he works."

Secretary Cohen said a 1967 change in the dependency requirements for the children of women workers made about 175,000 young persons eligible for payments. A large number of them are in the 18-22 age group and are attending school. They must apply for benefits before their payments can start.

Young people in the 18-22 age group whose mothers died after working under social security, or whose mothers are retired or disabled, should get in touch with the nearest social security office if they are not already receiving social security student's benefits, Secretary Cohen advised.

astronauts, pay the penalty of our cravenness. For we miss out on an experience with God that is known to few. Certain it is that any man who enters outer space, and orbits the earth, must be nearer to God, more humble in spirit, more aware of His wonders, than we earth-bound creatures can ever hope to be.

The miracle of God is still around us; it is clearly visible in the curving blue of the sky in the morning; the dark midnight, lit by jewels, of that same sky at night; it is clearly apparent in the song of the birds, and in the cry of a baby newly emerged from its mother's womb.

We do not fully understand the miracle of birth; we can only be completely awed by it. We do not understand the workings of God; we can only accept them. We must not sin, as Job sinned, in questioning His ways. Knowledge fades; mystery deepens—but God's infinitude lives on.

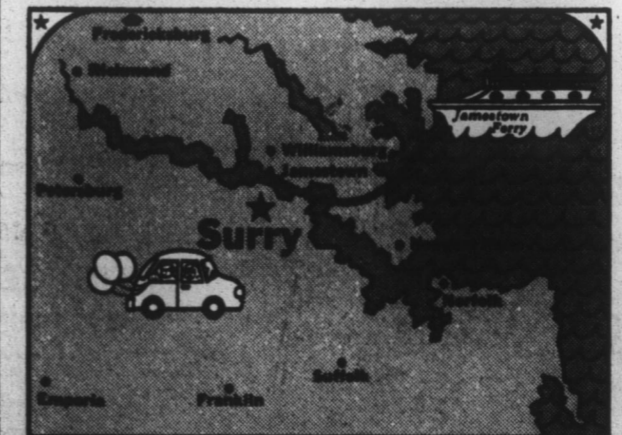
