 - 1 quart milk.
 - 1 can each of condensed milk and evaporated milk.
 - 1 pint cream.
 - 2 cups sugar mixed with 1 tablespoon flour.
 - 1 teaspoon vanilla.
- Beat eggs and mix with milks. Beat cream slightly and add to milk. Then add remaining ingredients, along with one quart of sweetened peaches. Freeze according to instructions of freezer.




