## Students Told To Secure Form

GREENSBORO — Thousands of students who worked during the summer months will soon be receiving their forms W-2 (tax withholding statements) from their employers.

J. E. Wall, North Carolina district director, has reminded students to place their W-2's in a safe place so the forms will be available when the time comes to file 1968 income tax returns. Wall said that refunds of tax withheld on wages can only be obtained through the filing of a tax return. Returns for 1968 are filed between January 1 and April 15, 1969.

Wall pointed out that parents of full-time students, or non-students under age 19, may claim their children as dependents if the parent furnishes major support for the child during the year.

Married full-time students may be claimed by parents who furnish the child's chief support, unless the child files a joint return with his or her spouse.

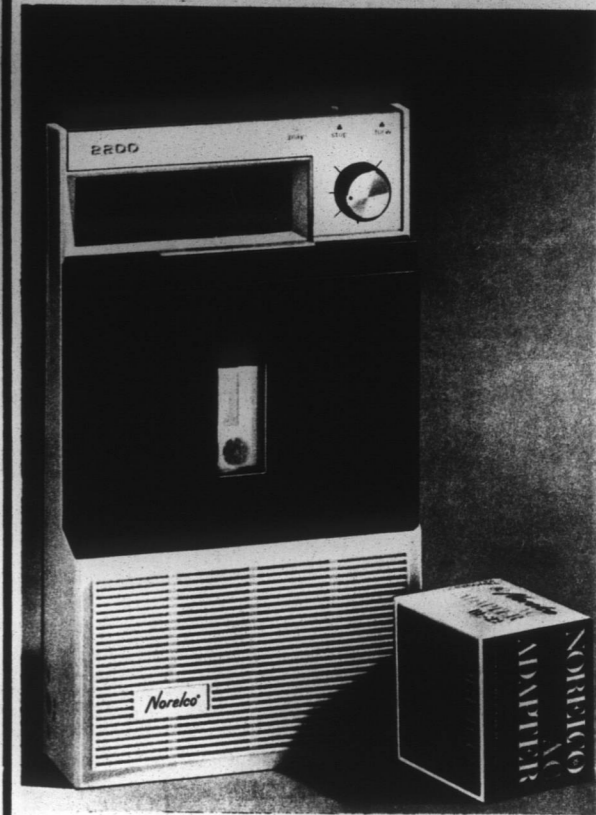

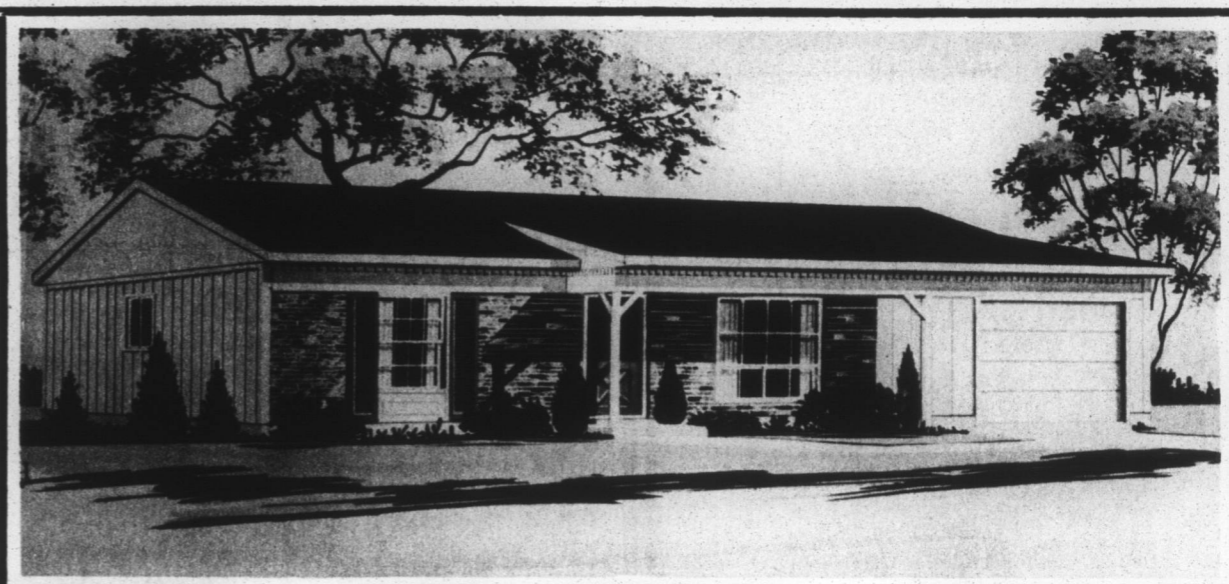
