



## Know Your Social Security

Donald Morris, Field Representative of the Social Security Administration, is in Edenton every Thursday

Social security beneficiaries in Chowan County who need to report their changes of address or other events that affect the payment of their monthly benefits may now do so through the social security office at 401 South Dyer Street in Elizabeth City. Robert Alford, officer-in-charge, said today. Reports may be made by mail, telephone or personal visit.

Alford said that up to now beneficiaries were encouraged to notify the Social Security Administration about the occurrence of these events on postcard forms pre-addressed to one of six social security record centers throughout the country. Beneficiaries re-

ceived the postcard forms when they initially applied for monthly benefits.

Alford said that the change in reporting methods is designed to reduce the time needed to change addresses and process other information having an effect on payment of monthly benefits. The change is prompted by the increased capacity of social security district offices to transmit the information over high speed communication circuits to record offices.

In addition to address changes Alford said that events that affect receipt of monthly social security checks include employment, marriage or remarriage in some instances, divorce and death.


