All voters who registered during the new registration in the spring of 1968 WILL NOT have to register again.

All voters who registered but have moved to another precinct must apply for a transfer at the precinct in which he NOW resides.

A person seeking to vote must have resided in the State of North Carolina for one year, and in the precinct in which he seeks to register for 30 days by the date of the General Election.

A new resident who has been a resident of the state for not less than 60 days prior to the General Election shall be entitled to register and vote for presidential and vice-presidential electors but for no other offices. Such person must appear before the Chairman of the Board of Elections not more than 20 days before and not later than 5 P. M., on Friday preceding Election Day.
