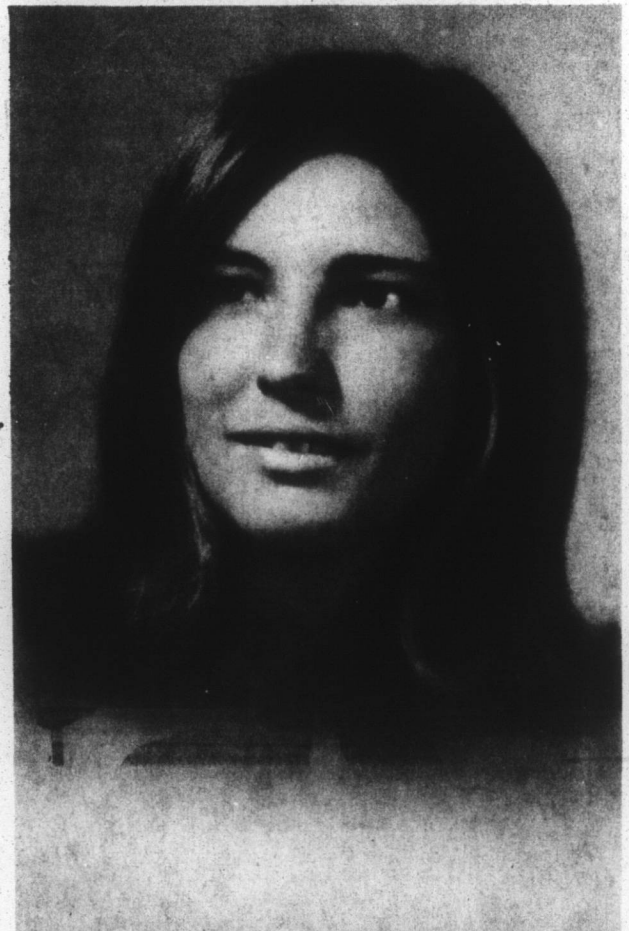
Mr. Hounsell's parents are Mr. and Mrs. R. A. Hounsell of Whittier, Calif.
