Insurance Tax Being Reduced

A lower unemployment insurance tax schedule will be in effect in 1969 and the reduced rates will save an estimated \$6 million for covered North Carolina employers.

The tax scale, which is determined by the amount of money in the state's unemployment insurance fund, will drop taxes for som employers to as low as .2 per cent of their taxable payrolls.

John Thomas, manager of the state employment office here, said the Employment Security Commission announced the new tax rate Friday, saying that employment among workers covered by unemployment insurance had been low enough to enable North Carolina to maintain a fairly high unem-

ployment insurance fund. The program is financed by excise taxes paid by employers on most industrial payrolls. Benefits paid to jobless workers under the program come from a trust fund maintained by taxes on the first \$3,000 paid to covered workers. A special "experience rating" feature of the North Carolina law allows companies and firms with good history of employment to qualify for reduced taxes.

The 1969 tax rates will range from .2 to 2.7 per cent for employers who have a balance in their un. employment insurance accounts, and from 2.9 to 4.7 per cent for employers who have deficit reserves.

Thomas said the commission estimates the average tax rate will be 1.1 per cent in 1969, lowest in North Carolina since 1955.

"Industrial payrolls have been increasing every year," he said, "and unemployment has been declining. With fewer unemployment insurance benefits being paid, the state reserve fund has become great enough to permit lower taxes for most employ-
