George Lewis Is Key Banker

To coordinate the agricultural activities of the N. C. Bankers Association in this area, George W. Lewis has been named County Key Banker for Chowan County.

NCBA President J. Paul Ford of Belmont has announced that Lewis will serve as County Key Banker during the next 12 months. He is executive vice president of Peoples Bank & Trust Company in Edenton.

For 23 years the NCBA has received national recognition for its far-reaching program of service to agriculture in North Carolina. President Ford, noting the work of bankers in behalf of agriculture, thanked the 100 County Key Bankers for their role in this record.

Ford called attention to the projects that are sponsored by the association such as the annual Farm Credit Conference which will again be held in Raleigh February 10-11, 1969, the two-week school at N. C. State University for young farmers who are provided scholarships given by their home community banks, and the co-sponsorship of the land judging meet in the interest of soil conservation. He also reported that the banks of North Carolina continue to lend more money to farmers than any other institutional group of lenders, last year providing \$161 million in loans.

Swine Program Being Planned

The 1969 Spotted Winter Type Conference will be held at the Pitt County Fairgrounds in Greenville. The two-day event, February 17 and 18, will feature an educational program of interest to anyone in the swine industry.

The spotted breed has made rapid advances in improvement during the past year as noted by an increase of 64 per cent in pacesetter litters and record cutouts for the breed

at its 1968 Summer Type Conference and 1968 National Barrow Show.

The program will place major emphasis on production and certification traits. Included in the activities will be on-foot and carcass barrow classes, certification pairs, type discussion, judging contest, a banquet, featuring Dr. M. D. Whiteaker of the University of Kentucky as speaker, and a show and sale of bred gilts, fall boars and gilts.

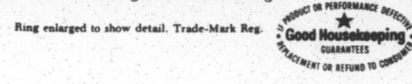

Misunderstanding On S. S. Reports

Although most employers know how to report wages for social security, some are still not sure of the special rules that apply to domestic workers.

A worker must show his social security card to his employer when he or she starts to work. The employer reports the name, the number and wages to Internal Revenue Service at the end of the calendar quarter in which the wages are paid. He also sends a check covering the tax contribution along with his report. The reports and contributions are due for all household workers who are paid \$50 or more in cash by one employer during the calendar quarter.

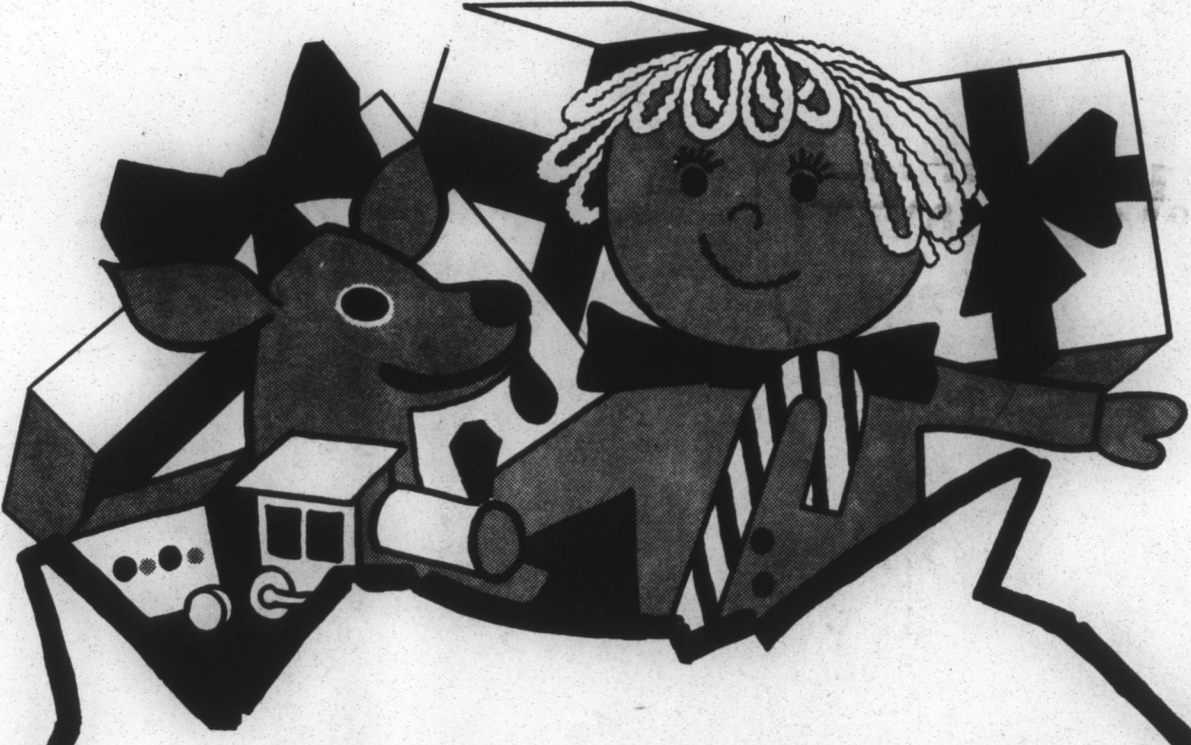
There is some misunderstanding also about reporting wages of farm workers. The wages of an agricultural worker must be reported if he is paid as much as \$150 in cash or is employed 20 days or more in the year on a time basis. This report is made to Internal Revenue each year when the farm employer files his tax return.

Q. I desire to change the beneficiary on my government life insurance policy. Do I have to send my policy back to VA for this?

A. No, you need not return your policy. Merely write your nearest VA regional office or the office to which you make your premium payments. Your letter will be accepted as a change and you will be sent the appropriate forms to list your designated beneficiaries in a more official manner.
