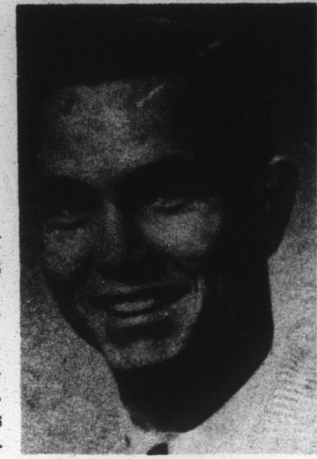
# Rogerson Given National Post

Applicant further seeks approval of the following rates:

## WATER RATE SCHEDULE Residential Service

Rates: For the first 4,000 gallons, \$4.00. For the next 5,000 gallons, 75c per M (Thousand). For the next 10,000 gallons, 60c per M. Over 19,000 gallons, 40c per M. Connection Charges: \$200.00 per service installed.

Conditions: Unmetered part-time residents will be billed the minimum monthly charge.

The Company reserves the right to meter water consumption from fire hydrants when such consumption is for other than fire-fighting purposes. Water thus consumed will be billed in accordance with the schedule of meter rates.

## Fire Protection Service:

For any customer having a sprinkler system of fire protection the following rates shall be applicable:

First 100 sprinkler heads, 8c each per month. Next 200 sprinkler heads, 5c each per month. Next 200 sprinkler heads, 4c each per month. All over 500 sprinkler heads, 3c each per month.

The minimum bill for any such customer shall be \$20.00 per month.

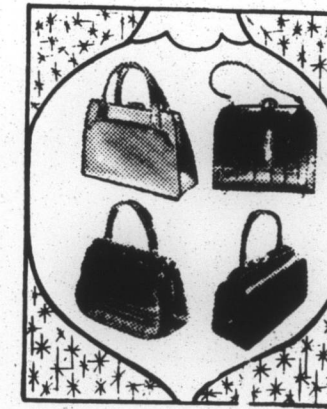
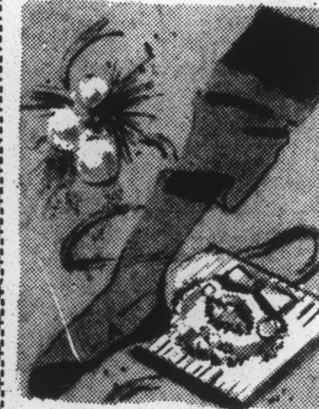
