Mix cake mix with jello. Add eggs, water and oil. Fold in berries. Bake in two greased and floured pans and bake for 30 to 35 minutes in 350 degree oven. Frost with one box of confectioner's sugar mixed with ½ pkg. strawberries (drained) and one stick of softened butter. (Thanks, Mrs. Parks).
