Farm operators are reminded that applications for the transfer of cotton allotments for the 1969 crop year should be filed no later than December 31, 1968.

### Wool

Farmers who have sold wool or unshorn lambs during this calendar year, 1968, should file an application for incentive payments at the County ASCS office on or before January 31, 1969. Producers are reminded that a bill of sale must be filed at

the county office at the time the application is filed.

### Report Changes In Farming Operations

Farmers having changes in their farming operations for 1969 should notify the County ASCS office in order for the records to be changed and information pertaining to the farm be sent to the correct farm operator.

Saturday afternoon was such a good time to stay home and bake cookies, and I did just that, while Buff picked out pecans and watched numerous football games. Here's one of the recipes I used and the cookies are delicious:

**Cherry Winkies**  
Sift together 2 1/2 cups flour, 1 tsp. baking powder and 1/2 tsp. soda. Cream 3/4 cup butter and 1 cup sugar. Add 2 eggs, 2 tbs. milk and 1 tsp. vanilla. Blend in dry ingredients and mix well. Add 1 cup chopped pecans and 1/3 cup Marschino cherries chopped and drained. Drop by teaspoon in 2 1/2 cups of crushed corn flakes, toss lightly to coat and shape into balls. Place on greased cookie sheet

and bake 12-15 minutes at 375 degrees. (I also rolled some cookies in crushed pecans and shredded coconut). Top with pieces of red and green cherries.

Here's another recipe sent from Mrs. L. J. Hines of Turkey, N. C. By the way of my friend, Edna Barnhill of Winston-Salem:

**Holiday Fruit Balls**  
1 lb. each graham cracker crumbs, candied pineapple, chopped, cherries chopped, raisins and marshmallows.

3 lbs. chopped nuts.  
1 can evaporated milk.  
1 stick butter.  
1 can flaked coconut.  
In sauce pan melt margarine and marshmallows in milk over low heat, stirring constantly. Mix together remaining ingredients, except coconut and pour milk mixture over it. Stir until well mixed and shape into 1 1/2 inch balls and roll in coconut. Makes 200.

### A FEW HINTS

Fruit stains can be removed from washable materials by rubbing the stained portion with powdered borax and then pouring boiling water through the fabric.

Dip stewed prunes into melted marshmallows and then in shredded coconut for a dessert treat.  
Spray candles with hair spray or spray starch and while wet, sprinkle them with glitter—pretty holiday candles!
