An all-out effort has been underway for some time by the association and related agribusinesses to make this meeting the most successful of its kind ever held in North Carolina. Hundreds of producers and agribusinessmen are expected to attend to see and hear authorities in agriculture from across the nation "tell it like it is," which is the theme of this most important meeting.
