We decided on a fund raising project to enable us to go camping this May.


Each patrol worked on different badges.

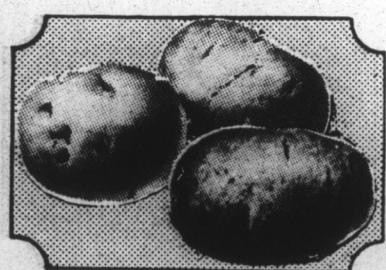
