Chocolate Chess Pie
½ stick butter.
¾ teaspoons cocoa.
1½ cups sugar.
1 tsp. vanilla.
2 eggs.
1 small can of milk.
Mix cocoa, sugar, then add melted butter, beaten eggs, vanilla and milk. Pour in uncooked pie shell and bake for 35 minutes at 350 degrees.

A Few Hints
You'll get more heat from radiators if you coat them with flat paint rather than aluminum paint. Make it easier for children to pull on their boots by attaching a large key ring on the zipper pull. If you have a stamp without glue on it, moisten the back of it and rub it over the flap of the envelope. It will absorb enough glue to stick. A rubber jar ring cemented to your dog dish will prevent it from slipping. Varnished surfaces clean nicely with a soft cloth dipped in cool tea. If the rung of a chair keeps loosening after being fixed with glue, try plastic wood the next time. A damp sponge sprinkled with soda will remove tea and coffee stains from china without scratching the surface.
