Pilot Survey Slated In Area

The Albemarle Choral Society has been chosen as the pilot group for a nation-wide survey of organization and management plans, materials studied and performed, and benefits derived by members of choral organizations operating under the auspices of college and university continuing education programs. The survey is being conducted by Prof. Paul A. Aliapoulos, member of the East Carolina University music education faculty.

The purpose of the survey is to further the founding of area and community groups who, like the Albemarle Society, conduct rehearsal meetings on a division basis and who, by combining division forces, can perform major items of choral literature.

In order to make the pilot survey as complete as possible, former members as well as those presently enrolled are urged to attend the next rehearsal meetings of the society's divisions in Edenton and Elizabeth City. The individual questionnaire forms can be completed in 10 minutes.

The pilot survey goes to press March 1 and will be used as the model for materials which will be distributed to continuing education administrators throughout the country.

one brother, William Tyner, one sister, Miss Pearl Ashley of Tyner, and one grandchild.

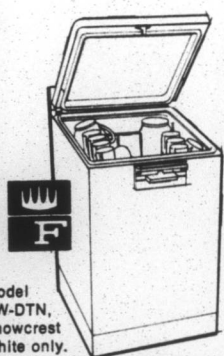
