Mrs. Phillips' Father Buried

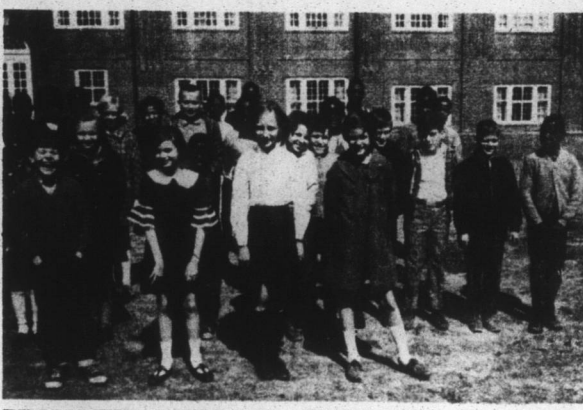
Funeral services were held Monday for John Henry Burnett, 80, of Burgaw.
