## News From ASCS Office

Feed Grain, Wheat and Cotton

The sign up for feed grain and cotton ends on March 21, 1969. Producers participating in the feed grain and wheat programs may earn diversion and/or price support payments. Only corn harvested from farms participating in the feed grain program is eligible for loan.

Through March 10 we had 247 farms participating in the feed grain program, 316 in the cotton program and 13 in the wheat program with advance payments amounting to \$63,583.70. If you plan to go in one or more of these programs, please visit the county office and sign up now. The final

date to sign up is March 21.

### Premeasurement Service

Again this year it will be the producers responsibility to accurately determine and report to the ASCS office his crop and land uses. Incorrect reporting of acreage or failure to fully meet program requirements can be very costly. For this reason we are offering premeasurement services before planting. The rates for this service is \$0.80 per acre for all crops and land uses plus a \$3.00 flat fee with a \$7.50 minimum charge per farm.

So before guessing and taking a chance, contact the county ASCS office and have your land pre-measured.

### ACP

Requests are now being accepted for federal cost-share assistance. Farmers planning to carry out a conservation practice on their farm this spring are urged to make applications for assistance. Your request must be filed and approval obtained before the practice is started.

April 1: Final date to lease and transfer flue-cured tobacco and peanut allotments.
