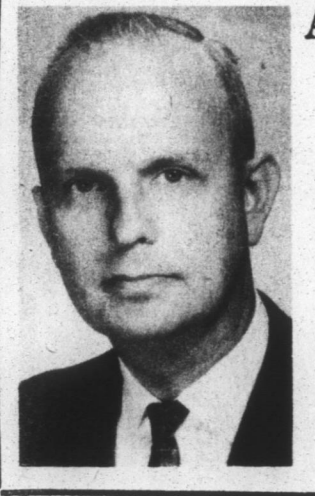
I'll be glad when Daylight Saving Time starts. It will give us longer time to fish. We've been fishing every evening this week, but it gets dark too soon.
