

Maps Of State Are Distributed

RALEIGH—The new official 1969 North Carolina highway maps have started arriving at the State Highway Commission here and distribution will be made as speedily as possible, H. Boyce Midgette, state locating engineer, said today.

Midgette said that the maps are being sent to other state agencies which help get them to motorists and that they will also be available to persons desiring them at the Highway Building on Wilmington Street.

The Department of Conservation and Development, which promotes tourism and operates the state's Welcome Centers, annually gets 100,000 copies of the maps. Other agencies, such as the State Highway Patrol and the State Ports Authority, get smaller quotas.

The new maps contain all of the latest road information, as well as a list of places of interest in the state. The back is covered with multi-colored scenes of North Carolina, including scenic spots and resorts.

Not enough maps to meet the initial demand have been received, Midgette said, but deliveries from the printer are expected daily.

Persons wishing a copy of the map can get one by writing the State Highway Commission but Midgette asked that they use postcards for faster handling.

The first copy of the new map was presented to Gov. Bob Scott by Highway Commission Chairman Lauch Faircloth.

It is not necessarily true that a man is a devout Christian, just because he reads the Bible. One must apply to one's own life what one reads—that is the truly devout Christian.

The study of the Bible should be purposeful. It should be primarily concerned with learning. This may take more than one reading, for in one reading, one particular facet makes itself felt; in the second reading, another; in a third, a deeper insight brings to light a still different slant—and so on. For as we grow, we should learn; and as we learn, we should grow. Our knowledge of the Bible, and of its portent, should measure our growth.

Senator Sam Ervin Says

WASHINGTON — The recent action by the Iowa legislature calling for a national convention to amend the Constitution makes it urgent that Congress enact legislation to establish orderly procedures relating to such a convention.

Iowa's petition, if the other 33 petitions are in order, is one shy of the requisite number of states necessary to require Congress to issue such a call. The fact is that there is a total lack of precedents concerning this method of amending the Constitution. Until now, Congress has proposed amendments to the Constitution, and the alternative amendment process by constitutional convention has been unused.

Soon there is a likelihood that Congress will be faced with a mandate to call a national convention. The Constitution states emphatically that "Congress shall call a convention" for the purpose of amending the Constitution upon application of two-thirds of the state legislatures.

At the last Congress and again at this Congress, I introduced a bill to clarify the confusion which has developed over convention procedures. Many have expressed fears about such a convention. In my judgment, most of these concerns arise out of fear that a convention might seek to rewrite the entire Constitution. Recognizing this, and also the duty of Congress to deal with the problem under the present circumstances, my bill establishes the framework of such a convention and deals with the procedural complexities that have never before been dealt with by law.

The measure which I have introduced in no way seeks to resolve the substantive aspects of apportionment of state legislatures, which seems to have brought out the petitions to Congress and created the possibility of a convention. Instead, it deals with petitions, their transmittal, their effective period, their rescission, the convention call, the selection of delegates, the selection of the presiding officer, the manner of voting, the proposal of amendments, and the termination of a convention. Essentially, my bill would substitute an established procedure for varying opinions as to how these procedural questions be resolved.

Under my bill, the states would propose individual amendments, and the convention would be called when two-thirds of the states petitioned Congress on the same subject. De-

legates would also be under oath not to consider changes in the Constitution beyond the general nature of those specified by the State legislatures, and Congress would be empowered not to submit any other amendments proposed by the convention.

My bill would also provide for the selection of delegates to the convention. Under it, the number of delegates would equal the membership in both Houses of Congress. Two delegates from each State would be chosen at large, and one delegate would be chosen from each Congressional district. Each delegate would have one

vote in the convention, and would cast his vote upon an individual basis. A majority vote would be required to propose an amendment.

Other provisions of my bill would provide that petitions would be effective for four years, that states could rescind their petition up to the date when two-thirds of the states petitioned for a convention, and that the convention would terminate its proceedings within one year.

This bill should be enacted without further delay. Congress may be requested soon to call a national convention by the requisite number of states.
