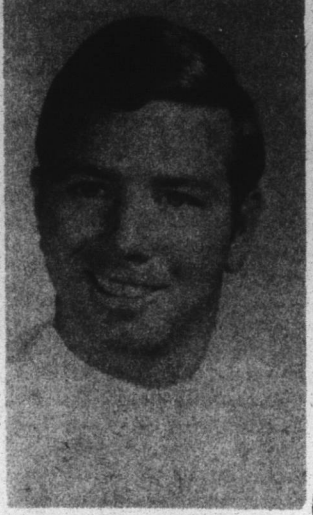

Happy Orange Cake
1 cup butter.
1 1/2 cups sugar.
3 egg yolks.
3 cups unsifted flour.
1 teaspoon baking powder.

1 teaspoon salt.
1 teaspoon soda.
1 cup buttermilk.
2 tablespoons grated orange peel.
1 cup finely chopped walnuts.
6 egg whites.

In large mixer bowl, cream butter until light; gradually add sugar, beating until fluffy. Add egg yolks, beat until blended. Sift together dry ingredients; add to creamed mixture alternately with buttermilk. Beat at medium speed five minutes. Reserve two teaspoons chopped walnuts for garnish; add remaining walnuts and orange peel to batter, stirring with a spoon or spatula until evenly blended. In large bowl, beat egg whites at high speed until very stiff, but not dry. Gently, but thoroughly, fold whites into batter. Pour into a well-greased and floured 10-inch cake pan. Bake at 350 degrees for one hour. Let stand three minutes before turning out onto wire rack. When cool, drizzle topping over cake and sprinkle with chopped nuts.

For the topping beat together one teaspoon grated orange peel, two tablespoons orange juice and one and one-fourth cups unsifted powdered sugar. Drizzle over cooled cake.
