Vaughn, a native of Lub- The brood mare stable has 20 stalls with each mare and colt having an individual pasture. An old stallion barn, replaced by a new one, is being used as a hospital.

Other structures include a 20-stall yearling barn, Vaughn's new home, an office, feed storage barn and hay drier. Interspersed among the pastures and buildings are wooded areas which eventually will have a 20-foot clearance between lawn grasses for beautifi-

Vaughn's interest has turned the farm into a haven for wildlife as well as horses. Last winter. tons of feed were put out for deer, geese, duck and quail. Vaughn estimates there are at least 30 convey of quail on the farm.

An attack on the mosquito population is being implemented with the erection of houses for 800 Martins and a water gut being formed so the water level can be raised and lowered to kill larvae.


