- 1 medium can crushed pineapple.

Combine gelatin, sugar and salt. Stir in 1/2 cup cold milk and allow to soften five minutes. Heat remaining milk and add to gelatin mixture and stir until dissolved. Cool until mixture becomes thick and syrupy. Blend in cottage cheese, salad dressing and pineapple. Pour into oiled mold and chill until firm. Makes six to eight servings.
