## Twiddys Receive National Award

Glowing predictions of improved home sales in the months ahead were heard by Warren and George Twiddy at the 29th annual meeting of the National Homes builder organization in Martinsville, Va.

The predictions were made by James R. Price, board chairman and chief executive officer of National Homes Corporation, largest home manufacturer in the United States.

Price reported that the National Homes builder organization showed a 32.4 per cent gain in the first six months of 1969, as compared with 1968. This compares with only a six per cent increase in housing starts generally. The organization's single family home sales were up 30.3 per cent, while the industry was down 4.6 during the same period.

## Questions - Answers About Social Security

Q. I am a school teacher and will be age 62 this summer. Should I file to receive social security checks during the summer when I will not be teaching or should I wait until I reach age 65 and get full benefits?

A. The decision is yours. However, you would be ahead by receiving benefits during the summer months for the next three years unless you expect to live until your late seventies. Check with your local social security office for an exact explanation of this as it applies to your particular case.

Q. I have been advised by my doctor to file a claim for social security disability checks as I suffer a stroke several months ago. I asked him for a statement about my condition but he said this was not necessary now. Is this correct?

A. Yes. If and when the social security folks want a report from your present doctor, they will ask you to take the request to him for completion.

Q. I receive a small social security check. Will getting this check keep me from receiving an old-age assistance grant from the local social services department.

A. Not necessarily. Get in touch with your local social services department. They will determine whether you can get a payment.

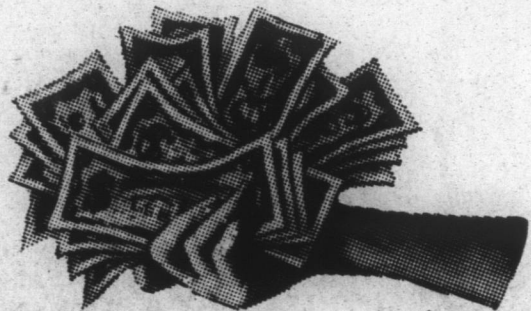
