Examined closely, an opening will be found in the tip of the bag through which the worm emerges at night, feeds on the foliage and then returns to sleep during the day.

Picking them off and destroying the bags is a tedious and time consuming process. The easy and most effective way to control them is by spraying or dusting the plants thoroughly with a good insecti-The Sea of Grass by cide such as malathion or toxaphene. In the case of malathion, use two teaspoons of 57% EC liquid What I'm Going to Do, I or two tablespoons of 25% wetable powder to a gallon of water. A repeat application may be needed in a week to 10 days.
