A FEW HINTS

They are quite easy to make, too. I just peel and core the apples, cover them with salted water until I have the pastry made. This I make from prepared biscuit mix, with sugar added. Then I roll out a square of pastry, set the whole apple on a teaspoonful of sugar on the pastry. Then I fill the center with more sugar, a dab of butter, a sprinkle of lemon juice, a dash each of cinnamon and nutmeg, wrap the pastry around it, put in a buttered baking dish, sprinkle sugar in and around the dumpling and let it bake slowly until the apple is cooked through.
